

Subsidized Housing in Washington DC

What is Subsidized Housing?

Permanent housing in an apartment building where the tenant pays 30% of their income towards rent, and the government pays (subsidizes) the rest. Some other names for these buildings are "Site Based Section 8," "Project Based Section 8," or "In House Section 8."

There are about 100 buildings in DC with this subsidy, but these buildings are all full to capacity and **each of the buildings maintains a waiting list**. Some wait lists are so long that the building is not accepting any new applications.

Who is Eligible?

Any low-income individual or family is eligible to apply for subsidized housing. Each building has its own eligibility criteria

- Some buildings are open to anyone.
- Senior buildings require a minimum age of 62.
- Some senior buildings allow younger people to apply if they have a disabling condition (but require that all household members be at least 18).

How Do I Get On The Wait Lists?

The only way to get your name on a housing wait list is to complete and submit an application to each individual apartment building.

There is no centralized process to apply. Each building has its own application, its own criteria, and its own wait list. You must apply separately at each building in which you are interested. Their wait lists open and close on their own schedule and are not coordinated with each other.

Remember:

- Bread for the City does not have housing.
- Bread for the City cannot place you in housing and has no influence over wait list placement.
- Bread for the City does not offer any type of financial or rental assistance.
- Unfortunately, Bread for the City cannot help you find immediate subsidized housing. The waiting lists are each several years long.

Application Completion Tips

- Many applications have a place for the Date at the top—do not fill this in! This is
 for the building to write in the date that the application was received by them.
- Don't sign anything until you turn it in. Some buildings require you to sign and date the application in front of them.
- Address every question—if the question doesn't apply or the answer is "None" or
 "0", write it in. You don't want the building to think you have skipped any
 questions. You also don't want to use "N/A" since many of the questions apply,
 but the answer is none or 0.
- Food Stamps are NOT counted as income and should not be included when the application asks about income sources.
- If you need to make a correction, draw a single line through it and have the applicant initial it. Do not use white out.
- When they ask if an applicant "expects to work" or "expects to receive" a benefit, they want to know if there is a definite yes.
 - If you have been told by Social Security that you will begin receiving benefits, or you have a start date for work, then the answer is Yes.
 - If you have an application pending or you are looking for work, the answer is No.

- Always use a stable mailing address and stable phone number. When your name comes to the top of their wait list, the building will probably mail a letter. Make sure to list an address where you can receive mail.
 - You can write "Homeless- mail to ..."

• Fill in the complete housing history, even if you are homeless, in a shelter, or staying with friends. The building wants to know where you have been staying, even if you are not on the lease or paying rent.

What are some of my housing options?

Emergency Shelter

- Call the Shelter Hotline (202-399-7093 or 311), Family Resource Center (202-526-0017, 920 Rhode Island Ave, NE) for more information.
- Immediate shelter for the night.
- No income needed.

Housing First Programs

- Housing programs for chronically homeless individuals and families (staying on the street or in shelters).
- You are **identified** by your Community Support Worker, Virginia Williams Family Resource Center, the Veteran's Administration, or through the city's Homelessness Assessment tool (VI-SPDAT).
- You may be offered Permanent Supportive Housing or Rapid Re-Housing.
- This is not immediate housing, as you have to wait to be identified and assessed.

Transitional Housing and Transitional Shelter Programs

- Time limited life skills/recovery programs for people living with mental illness, in recovery from substance abuse, and/or families, among others.
- Some programs require income, some do not.
- This is not immediate housing.

Single Room Occupancy (SRO)

- Permanent room rental program for single individuals who are homeless.
- Share kitchen, bathroom, and living space with others.
- Landlord is usually a program like SOME, Catholic Charities, or Community Family Life Services.
- Some programs are for people living with mental illness, in recovery from substance abuse, veterans, etc.
- Income is required, as residents pay a set rent amount (does not go by your income).
- This is not immediate housing.

DC Housing Authority Public Housing

- Rent an apartment from DC Housing Authority (DCHA) or obtain a voucher to use with private landlords.
- Rent is 30% of your income.
- This is not immediate housing.
- Waiting list is currently closed and they are not accepting any new applicants.
- Update your information on a regular basis. Call (202) 535-1000 to schedule an appointment or go online to dchousing.org.



What are some of my housing options?

Subsidized Housing

- Rent an apartment in a privately owned building that is subsidized by HUD.
- Rent is 30% of your income.
- Apply separately at each building.
- Some buildings require that you be 62+, or have a disabling condition; some have no requirements.
- They will run a background and credit check on you.
- This is not immediate housing.
- Also called Site-Based Section 8 or In-House Section 8.

"Affordable" Housing

- Rent amounts are calculated based on the Family Median Income (FMI) of the DC Area (which is more than \$105,000 for a single person and more than \$150,000 for a family of 4). Rent does not go by your individual income, but rather by the income of the general area.
- Income minimums and maximums; the minimum income is much higher than SSI and TANF amounts.
- Also called Tax Credit Properties.
- Look in the classifieds or on www.DCHousingSearch.org for more information.

Room Rental

- Rent a room in a house from a private landlord.
- Income is required; rent is determined by the owner or landlord and there is no subsidy.
- Ask friends and family if they know of anyone who wants to rent a room or look in coffee shops, rec centers, the newspaper, on the internet to see who has rooms for rent.

• Look in the classifieds and on www.CraigsList.org for rooms for rent.

Apartment Rental at Fair Market Rent

- Rent an apartment from a private landlord.
- Rent is often more than \$1000 for a studio size unit.
- Consider renting with a roommate to reduce costs.
- Look in the classifieds or on www.DCHousingSearch.org for more information.
